The Museum

The Museum is located at the rear of Grays Fire Station and was officially opened on 14th June 2007 and is housed in the former Auxiliary Fire Service garages, at the rear of Grays Fire Station.

On display is a collection of fire appliances ranging from hand drawn pumps to more modern apparatus.

Exhibits and information cover a wide range of the history of firefighting in Essex as well as items of a more general fire service nature.

The Museum has a number of dedicated volunteers. It is through their efforts alongside the invaluable support given by the Essex Fire Authority that the Museum has been able to effectively protect the Essex Fire Heritage and to create an infrastructure that will continue to protect and develop the collection for future generations. The Museum's day to day management is exercised through a collections officer and management committee.

The Museum holds a good selection of artefacts and documents relating to the wartime activities of the Fire Service.
