ROAD SAFETY

Safety when crossing

Over 500 young people die or are seriously injured every month. ALWAYS take headphones out when you cross the road. NEVER cross behind a bus or car because cars can't see you. If you are 12 to 19 you are the most likely to be killed by traffic. After school and work on Friday is the highest day of death. You MUST turn your phone off.



Car safety

You must wear your seatbelt. If you are younger than 14 your parents have to pay a £100 fine if you don't but if you are 14 or over you must pay it yourself. If your mum or dad is on the phone while driving you have all the rights to tell them to turn it off.





Road Safety

- You are 4x more likely to crash using a mobile phone while driving.
- If you the driver is on the phone whist driving you have the right to tell them to get of their phone.
- Over 500 young people are killed or seriously injured in on month.



ROAD SAFETY

- 1) Always remember to use the green cross code.
- 2) Friday is the busiest night to travel, so make sure you are safe.



- 3) Always wear your seat belt, when you are 14 or over you have to pay 100 fine.
- 4) Don't stand behind a bus to cross as the cars can't see you.
- 5) 12-19 year olds are most likely to get killed by traffic.
- 6) Over 500 young people get killed or seriously injured every month.
- 7) Remember to always take your headphones out before crossing the road.
- 8) Remember to never use your phone whilst driving as you are4x more likely to crash.
- 9) 14 and under your parents have to pay a £100 fine if you aren't wearing your seatbelt.
- 10) When crossing the road always put your phone away.
- 11) Always use the zebra crossing (it's safer[©])

ROAD SAFETY

Many people, mainly children (around 500 a month), are killed on the roads, traffic is the biggest killer of 12-16 year olds.



If you don't wear your seatbelt, you will be fined £100. If you're under 14 your parents you have to pay.

Friday between 3pm-5pm is most likely time to be killed on the road as people are desperate to get home.






Always use the green cross code

- 1. Find a safe place to cross
- 2. Stand on the pavement but not too close

to the road

- 3. Look and listen
- 4. Cross when there is no traffic and make sure there's enough time to cross.
 - 5. Keep looking and listening
 - 6. Walk straight across the road but don't run

Make sure you are not on your phone or have got your headphones in while crossing the road.
