

First Aid for Burns



- Remove jewellery and clothing from around the area, but not if it is stuck to the skin.
- Lots of water over the area for 10 to 30 minutes. But do not use ice, iced water or creams.
- Keep casualty warm.
- Lay cling film on rather than wrapping.
- Go to A&E or call an Ambulance if you think it may be serious.









Cool the burn with running cold tap water for 20 minutes & remove clothing & jewellery (unless it is melted or firmly stuck to the wound).



Call for help – 999, 111 or local GP for advice



Cover the burn with cling film or a sterile, non-fluffy dressing or cloth
