



















Causes of Fire















Unattended cooking





Making Your Community



When your smoke alarm sounds




- Check the temperature of the door with the back of your hand.
- Leave the room keeping below the smoke, closing the door behind you.
- With the rest of the family, make your way to the nearest exit.
- Do not investigate or attempt to collect belongings.
- Once safely outside dial 999.

First Aid for Burns



- Remove clothing and jewellery from the area as soon as possible. Leave clothing in place if it stuck to the skin.
- Cool the area with cool or lukewarm water for at least 10 minutes.
- Cover do not wrap, with a layer of cling film, to prevent infection.
- Seek professional help if necessary.





Home Security





Doors and Windows

In 1 in 10 burglaries, access is gained through an unlocked window or door.

Keep valuables out of site (eg. Phones, tablets, jewellery, car keys).

Always lock, garden gates, garages and Sheds.







Doors and Windows

Store away tools and ladders so they can't be used to aid burglars.

Do not leave keys outside of the property (e.g under a mat or in a plant pot). Where possible leave keys with a trusted person to allow access.

Use outside lighting and CCTV to deter burglars.



Shared Entrances







- Never buzz strangers in.
 - Ensure strangers can't follow you in (through communal entrances).





Property Marking

- Mark valuable items in your home.
- Register serial numbers of goods.



Consider having a safe in your home!

Keys

Don't leave keys where they can be seen or reached from the outside.

Don't have spare keys hidden outside.

Don't leave car keys lying around.



When you are away on holiday.

Ask friends to:

- Remove your post
- Turn on lights
- Open and close your curtains.




Safety with People at the door

• Use a spy hole / security chair

• Check ID's.





Don't admit you are on your own. Never answer the door if you are not comfortable Making Your Community Safer





Vehicle Crime

- Always lock your vehicle.
- Keep valuables out of sight.



- Remove electronic devices (SAT NAV's etc).
 - Be careful of where you leave your car keys.
